Equity Statement:

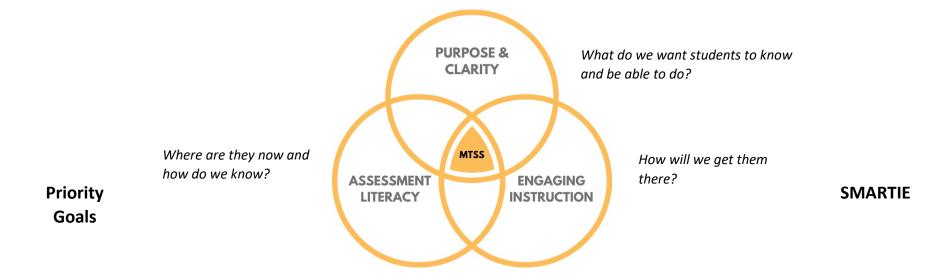

Academic Goals:

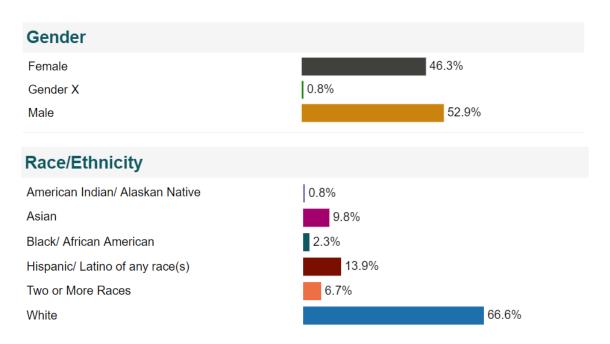
- a. Literacy: Academic goals
 - i. CER (Claim, Evidence, Reasoning) ELA initiative
 - 1. Each and every student will improve lexile level by a one year minimum in language arts STAR assessment data by June 2023 after implementing CER in ELA, History, Science, electives.
 - ii. Math goal: Assessment alignment
 - 1. Math classes will demonstrate a 12% improvement in growth as measured through the STAR assessment Average Scale Score (by class) after aligning common assessments and articulating of essential learning targets and pacing.
- b. Building Specific Goals
 - i. SEL growth as measured through the Panorama survey, discipline, and attendance
 - 1. 85% of students will show a connection to an adult at VVMS as indicated by the final Panorama survey of the year.
 - 2. School-wide discipline will reduce from over 400 referrals a year (2021-2022) to 100 in 2022-23.
 - 3. School-wide attendance rates will increase by statistical significance 3+/-% from 88% to 91%.

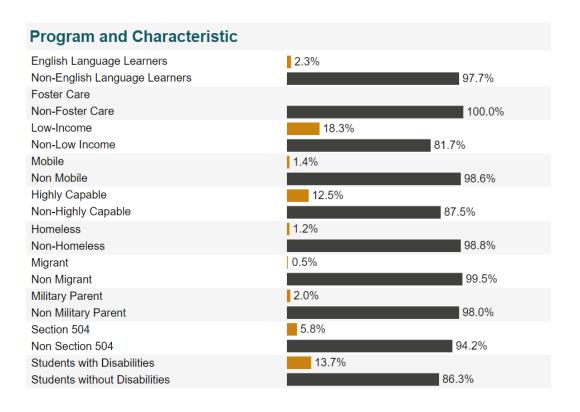
Valley View Demographics

Total Student Enrollment

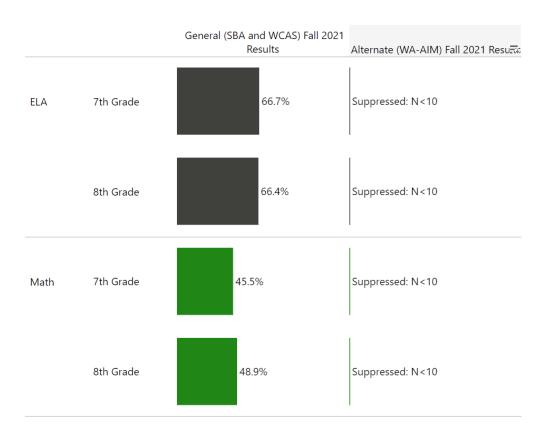
