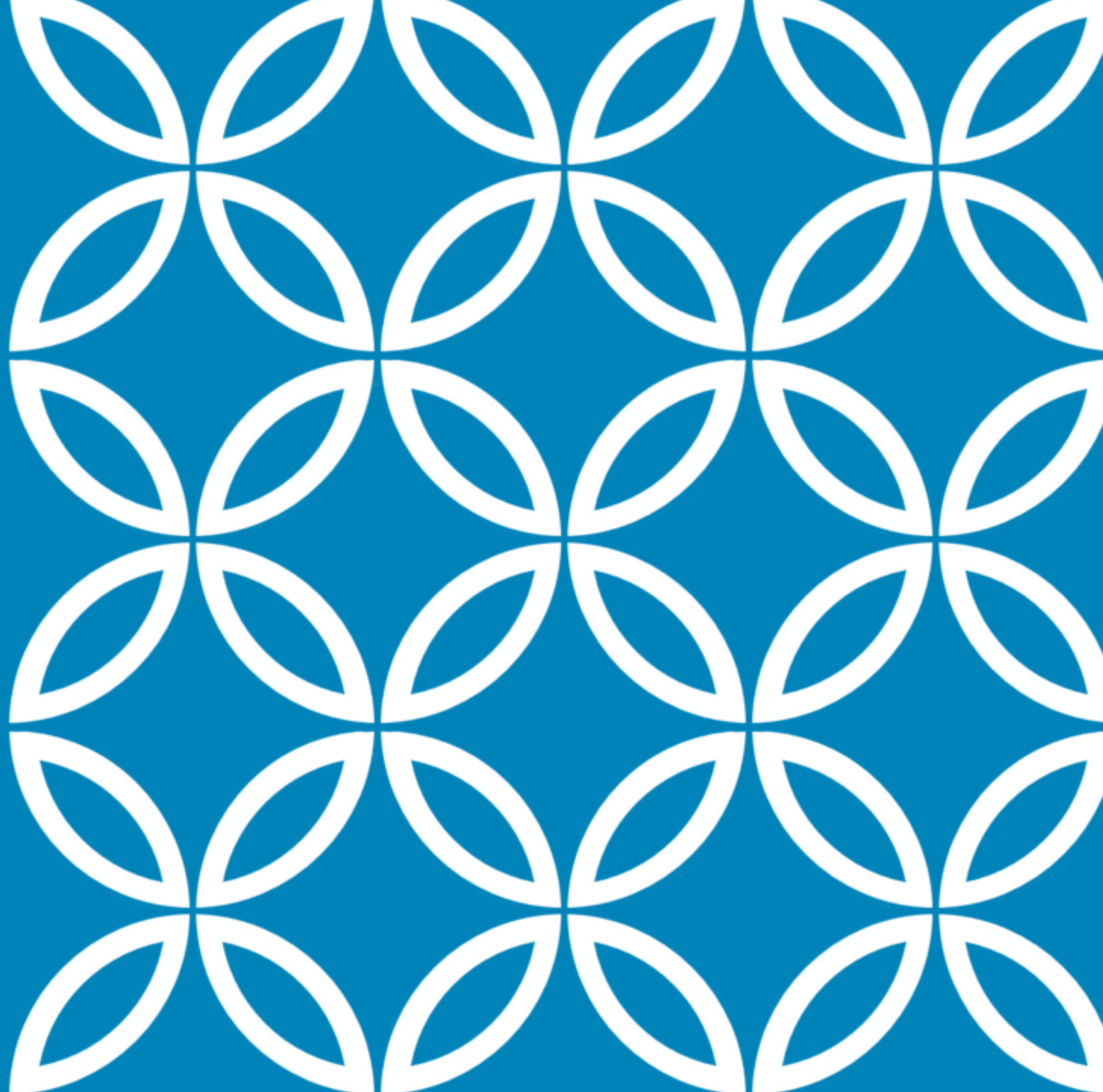

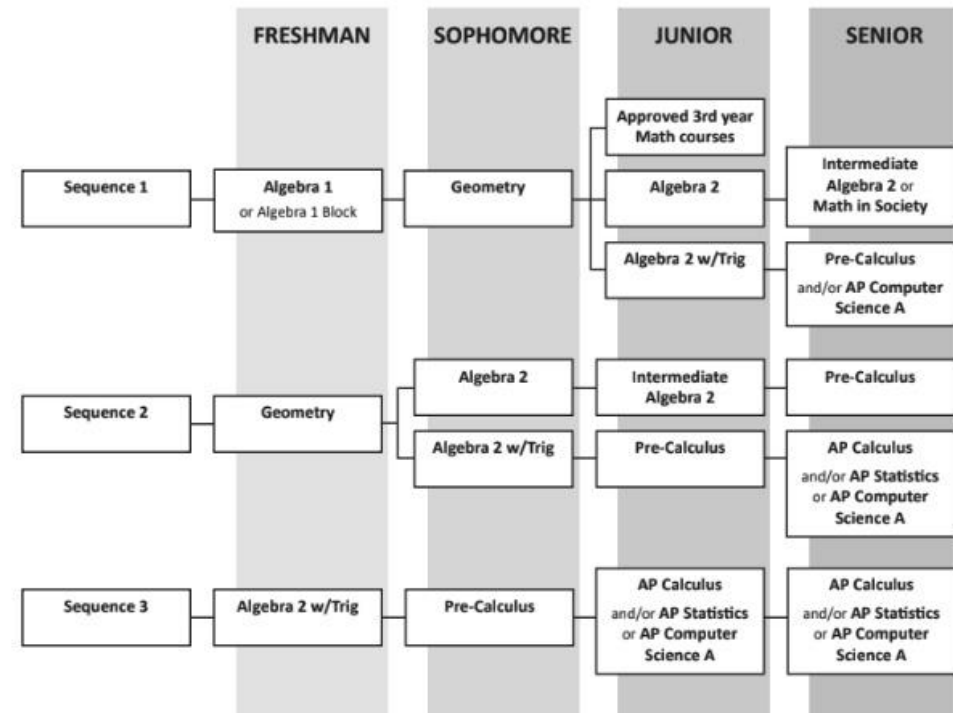

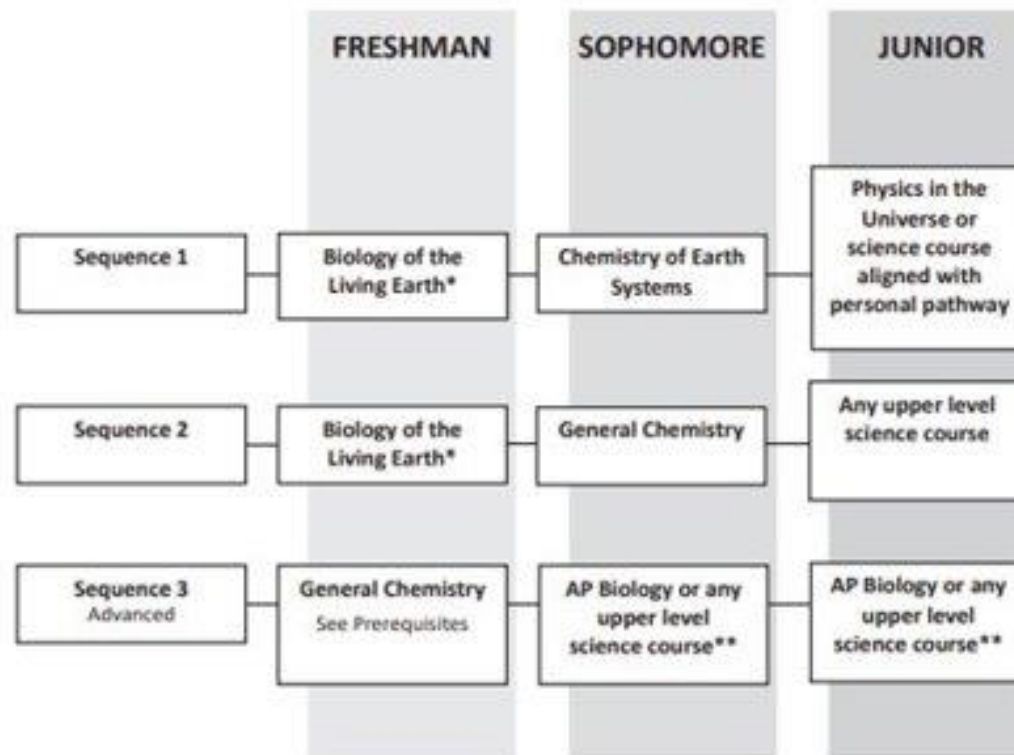

How does it work?

For example, taking Advanced CADD (yearlong) earns one credit toward the 24 required for graduation and fulfills two graduation requirements.

ONE CREDIT:

Advanced CADD

TWO REQUIREMENTS:

✓ 1 Requirement- CTE

✓ 1 Requirement- Art

- **Creates flexibility to choose more elective courses**
- **Can address other graduation requirements**

Students- check with your high school counselor or college admission offices to make sure the course will be accepted for admission purposes.
NCAA Requirements: Potential D1 or D2 athletes should check with their counselors annually regarding which Snohomish School District equivalency credits have been approved by the NCAA.

The current rule change to WAC 180-51-067 allows school districts to grant equivalency credit for courses offered in high schools.

Students who take a CTE-equivalency course may satisfy two graduation requirements while earning 1.0 credit for a yearlong course or 0.5 credit for a semester course; hence the "two for one".

CTE equivalencies are noted in the CTE program sections in this handbook.

WORLD LANGUAGE

Incoming Sophomores should consider taking a World Language for the following reasons:

- To meet the WL requirements for most four-year colleges.
- To be able to earn three or four years of World Language, to take an AP World Language or to enter a highly competitive college like Harvard or Stanford.
- To begin the practice of becoming fluent in a World Language.
- To free up senior year for a program like Sno-Isle Tech or Running Start.

Incoming Sophomores might consider waiting until junior year for World Language for the following reasons:

- They only wish to take two years of World Language as a sophomore year.
- They have a specialized program like DECA or BANL that is more competitive college which requires three or more years of WL.
