

# World Languages: Chinese, German & Spanish

- Reasons to take a world language your Freshmen year:
  - ▶ To have the opportunity to take 3 to 4 years of a world language at GP.
  - ➤ To satisfy the 2-year world lang. requirement for college entrance by your sophomore year.
- Reasons to not take a world language your Freshmen year:
  - Student prefers to start taking a world language their sophomore or junior year.
  - Student wants to be involved in Art, CTE or other electives their freshmen year.

It's essential to plan backwards. What classes or programs do you want to take as a senior or junior? This can guide you into classes as a freshmen.



# Helpful Guidelines for Families:

- ► Middle school classes on high school transcripts
  - ► Middle school math grade (Algebra 1 or Geometry) on your transcript: you can opt out prior to the end of your junior year.
  - ▶ A letter will be sent home to everyone as a reminder.

- ► It is import to help your child choose appropriate classes because that is how we build the master schedule, and they will be <u>unable to change</u> their courses once we build their schedules.

# ASB LEADERSHIP

Servant Leadership is the foundation of our program here at Glacier Peak. Our main objective is to strive to meet the needs of our school community. The Introduction to ASB Leadership course provides a foundation for building skills in communication, group process, managerial skills, and project planning. Units are presented in an interactive, application-based model.

The Advanced ASB Leadership course applies the foundational skills of leadership to serving the school community through activities, events, service projects, and recognition.



# ASB SENATE

PURPOSE: To promote a friendly and purposeful relationship between the school and community, encourage participation in extra-curricular activities, to establish high standards of leadership, cooperation, citizenship, and a better understanding of democratic government.

### **OPPORTUNITITES:**

- Class Officers: Four elected officers serve their grade level by planning grade level activities and fundraisers.
- Senators: Nine elected senators per grade level, one appointed. Senators are the decision-makers of the Senate.
- Judicial Branch: Two appointed positions per grade level. Justices make sure the Senate operates according to the ASB Constitution



# Club Opportunities

- Clubs provide students the opportunity to connect with peers through a common interest.
- There are over 44 active clubs at GP.
- Clubs meet before school, during Grizzly Period/Lunches, and after school.


