2024 Senior Information from the SHS College & Career Center

Seniors should be planning for what they intend to do after they graduate – Options are:

- a. Get a Job/start a Career Job
- **b.** Take a **Gap Year** (travel or earn money for school)
- c. Military
- d. Apprenticeship in one of the Skilled Trades
- e. Attend a Technical or Trade School (Career School)
- f. Attend a Community College or 4-year College or University.
- 1. **Seniors looking for part time jobs or career jobs**, the SHS College & Career Center Canvas page displays a **Part time Job Board** and a **Senior Job Board**. More jobs are added starting in the February/March.
- 2. **Joining the Military** Recruiters are available during lunch in the Commons, each branch once monthly.
 - Seniors can enlist in one of the military branches.
 - Seniors can apply for an ROTC program at one of the college campus' (tuition free).
- 3. **Apply for an Apprenticeship** in a skilled trade (learn a trade and work at the same time)
 - a. <u>7th Annual Apprenticeship Career & Job Fair</u> (AJAC & Sno-Isle), November 16, 4-7 p.m. at Sno-Isle Tech Skills Center. (Culinary, Healthcare, Carpentry, Maritime, Electricians, Construction, Manufacturing)
 - b. **Trade Up Event for our Seniors/Juniors**, April 18, 2024, this is an interactive field trip where students take a bus, to the Evergreen State Fairgrounds in Monroe. All day event trying out different trades. Lunch is provided.
 - c. Check out the Washington State Dept of Labor & Industries website, "Become an Apprentice" https://www.lni.wa.gov/licensing-permits/apprenticeship/become-an-apprentice
 - d. Contact the local labor union office to ask about apprenticeship programs available.
- 4. **Community Colleges/Technical/Trade schools** 34 community and technical colleges in Washington. (Apply in the spring)
 - a. There offer a **wide variety of skills**...Culinary...Automotive...Veterinary Tech...Park Ranger Academy...Fire Academy...Cyber Security...Nursing...just to name a few.
 - b. If you are planning on applying to a **technical/trade school in Washington**, please be aware of the application deadline.
 - Search for a program at a community college/technical school through the <u>College Program Search.</u>
 - Explore Our Colleges and get a list of all 34 community & technical colleges in WA.
 - c. Applying to Everett Community College:
 - Visit their <u>How To Apply</u> web page. This has a lot of information to answer your questions like, admission qualifications...when do I apply...application processing time etc.
 - In the springtime, EvCC holds an Application Workshop at SHS, during school, to help students apply.
 - b. <u>AMTEC</u> is a part of EvCC and has training for individual certificates or for taking an entire program.

- Advanced Manufacturing Training & Education Center offers a hands-on education in a variety of options: Precision Machining, Mechatronics (Robotics/Automation), Manufacturing, Engineering Technology (CAD), Composites, Welding and Fabrication.
- Career Services is available to help find a job upon completion of a program!
 They offer tours and information sessions!
- 5. **Don't know what I want to do when I grow up????** If you don't know what you want to do once you graduate, take an "Interest Survey."
 - a. An interest survey might spark an area or occupation that shows you having strong skills in an area that you may not have thought about before. 6. Attending a College/University next fall? What should I be doing?

- Seniors should be narrowing down their list of colleges they want to apply to.
- When applying, each college application has an application fee. There are fee waivers available for eligible students. (Free & Reduced Lunch and Alumni, friend/relative waivers)
- Visit the college websites and find out when the <u>Application and Scholarship</u> <u>deadlines</u> are. Deadlines start as early as <u>November 15th (UW)</u> and end as late as <u>March 31st (WSU)</u>. The college's scholarship deadlines usually occur earlier.
- Ask a teacher for a letter of recommendation. Not all college applications require it, but some scholarships do. Fill out the Letter of Rec <u>"Fillable Form"</u> and give it to the teacher. Get this done soon!
- Applications Most college applications across the country are either the <u>Common App</u> (one application for over 1000 schools), <u>Coalition</u> or the <u>college's own application</u>.
 California colleges, have their own two types of applications.
- Make sure to start the application early, in time to gather any needed information and complete it by the deadline.
- Write a <u>personal statement or essay</u> if one is required. Make sure to get additional help with proofreading.
- Try to **visit the college campus**' that you have applied to...each college campus has a different feel to it.
- Attend <u>College Visits</u> in the College & Career Center. (WWU, Gonzaga, Eastern, Oregon State, U of Oregon and Bellevue College.)
- Senior applicants will receive a <u>Financial Award Letter</u> from each college they apply to. These letters will show the **cost of tuition/housing/fees** along with any **grants**, scholarships, loan offers and Work study opportunities that are offered to the applicant. Take these into consideration when making your final decision.

December starts Scholarship Season! This season usually runs between December and April.

Where can I find Scholarships?

- <u>SHS College & Career Center webpage</u> there is a **Scholarship tab** with scholarship search engines...sign up for some of these search engines!
- Read College & Career Center Canvas announcements I send out an Extensive Scholarship Spreadsheet as often as I need to update it.
- <u>Local Scholarship Program</u> Snohomish Education Foundation runs this program
 with the district's C & CC's. Last year SHS seniors received over \$125,000. Opens in
 early February!
- 1) <u>Washboard.org</u> is the scholarship clearing house that we run the Local Scholarship Program through. Please go to Washboard.org and fill out a profile or update the one you already have.
- 2) The directions for this scholarship application can be found on the SHS College & Career Center webpage and in a Canvas announcement.
- 3) Deadline is usually in March.
- 4) Not all applicants will receive a scholarship. Scholarships range from \$200 \$5000, with a few of them being renewable for 4 years.
- a. Washington State Baccalaureate Scholarship STEM & Healthcare scholarship opens in Dec/Jan. Receive up to \$22,500. Medium household income scholarship.
- b. Scholarships for Military Children will be available in the spring.
- c. American Indian Scholarships will be available in December.
- d. Many more to come! Watch the Bulletin and Canvas Announcements.
- 7. Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or Washington Application for State Financial Aid (WASFA)—If you plan on attending any type of school in the fall, please fill out either the FAFSA or WASFA. If you do not have a U.S. Social Security number, then you would fill out the WASFA. Colleges/Trade/Tech schools use this to determine the financial aid they give to their applicants.
