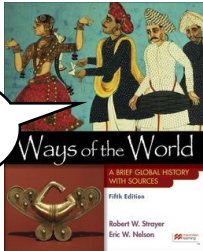

- The students will be able to take the AP exam in and earn college credit for qualifying scores or earn college credit through Everett Community College's "College in the High School" program.



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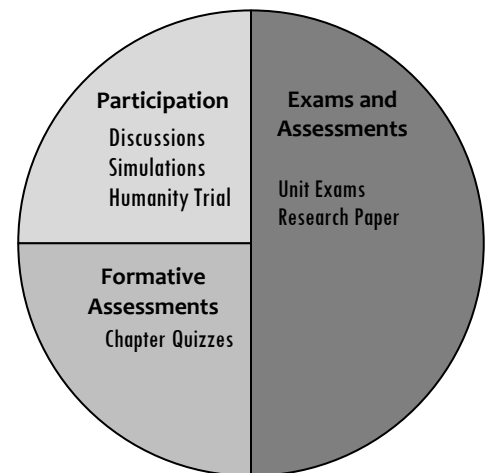
