CITIZENS FACILITY ADVISORY COMMITTEE (CFAC)

The Citizens Facility Advisory Committee (CFAC) is a Board of Directors appointed community group that studies district facilities for educational usefulness based on facility conditions, educational standards and enrollment projections.

To achieve the goal, the following activities are completed by the group:

- Review the physical conditions of the district facilities,
- Evaluate the physical conditions for adequacy and longevity of district operation,
- Review district demographic and student growth projections,
- Review the previous CFAC recommendations,
- Study current and future instructional and educational models,
- Prioritize facility needs and,
- Update the Board of Directors on a regular basis as determined by the Board of Directors. Ultimately the group will make a recommendation to the Board that helps guide the district's vision for its facilities.

HISTORY

- CFAC formed in 2003 to review and recommend to the Board of Directors facilities improvements based on need.
- CFAC reconvened 2007 to provide next phase of facility improvements recommendations to the Board of Directors.
- CFAC reconvened in 2018 and is continuing with facilities review and formulating a recommendation to the Board of Directors.

CURRENT CFAC PROCESS

- CFAC met May 2018 to begin studying building conditions, capacities, enrollment projections, and collecting other data.
- Committee has had 14 meetings to date.
- CFAC has toured all the district elementary schools to gain understanding of current conditions and standards.
- CFAC's goal is to provide the Board of Directors their facility improvement recommendation by the end of April 2019.

JANUARY 30 COMMUNITY MEETING

- From 6:30–8 p.m. on Wednesday, January 30, there will be a community meeting hosted by CFAC to share information and seek community input. This meeting will be held at the district's Resource and Service Center (1601 Avenue D in Snohomish).
- The meeting will include information on the state of facilities, enrollment capacities, enrollment projections, and facility standards.
- The meeting will also provide the CFAC draft priorities and solicit input from the attendees.
