### Finalists and competition

Student finalists will be selected and notified by late April 2019. Finalists will be selected from the submitted recipes and will be invited to prepare their creations at Glacier Peak High School. Families, teachers and principals will be invited to taste these culinary masterpieces at a **Friday, May 17**, event. The young chefs will feature their creations at a 4 p.m. reception on Friday, May 17, in the Glacier Peak High School Commons. A panel of judges will select the grand prize winners. Past award categories have included:

- Health-conscious foods
- Simple, kid-friendly preparation
- Fun food
- Judge's choice

All finalists will receive a framed certificate, a recipe book which includes all of the finalists' recipes, an apron/chef's coat, as well as a medal. Grand prize winners will receive an additional award. Transportation will not be provided for the cook-off. Kids will need to be dropped off and picked up at Glacier Peak High School. In addition, students will be supervised by kitchen staff and Glacier Peak High School culinary students during the food production to help ensure that safe food practices are followed and that no one gets hurt.
