Timing of Presentation

- WAC 392-410-140: Notification must occur at least one month prior to lessons
- District Sexual Health Policy and Procedure approved at the end of October 2018

Why teach HGD in 5th and 6th grade?

- To provide students with medically accurate and developmentally appropriate information to help them make decisions that impact their lifelong health and wellness, build healthy relationships, and protect themselves from sexually transmitted diseases and infection
- To help our students better understand the physiological changes that they experience at this stage in their lives
- To help ensure that students are safe, informed, and empowered
- HIV/AIDS prevention required by law to be taught annually in 5th -12th grade (AIDS Omnibus Act)

WAC 392-410-140

Sexual health education must be:

- Age appropriate
- Inclusive of students regardless of gender, race, disability status, or sexual orientation
- Includes information about abstinence and other methods of preventing unintended pregnancy and sexually transmitted diseases
- Medically and scientifically accurate

Medically and Scientifically Accurate Information

- Verified or supported by research in compliance with scientific methods
- Published in peer reviewed journals, where appropriate
- Recognized as accurate and objective by professional organizations and agencies with expertise in the field of sexual health including but not limited to the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists, the Washington State Department of Health and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

HGD instruction meets above requirements

Basic Information about the HGD Lessons

- Four lessons taught over four days
- Each lesson is 50-75 minutes in length approx.
- Male and female students will be in two different groups but will learn about both genders
- Focus on medically and scientifically accurate language
- School Board Approved Resources:
 - o Family, Life, and Sexual Health (FLASH) from OSPI List of Resources
 - You, Your Body, and Puberty Video

Pertinent State Standards

Standard 1: Comprehend concepts related to health promotion and disease prevention to enhance health.

Standard 7: Demonstrate the ability to **practice health-enhancing behaviors** and avoid or reduce health risks.

6th Grade


Learning Target:


Identify parts of both male and female reproductive systems.

6th Grade

Learning Target:


- Explain how STD's are transmitted.

- Identify examples of risk behaviors.

The purpose of HIV/AIDS Prevention and Human Growth and Development/Puberty instruction is to establish common learning goals across the district and to provide all students with medically accurate, developmentally appropriate, and bias-free information to help them make decisions that positively impact their lifelong health and wellness. HIV/AIDS prevention and human growth and development/puberty lessons are aligned with state academic standards in health.

The essential standards that will be covered in 5th and 6th grade are as follows:

Human Growth and Development/Puberty:

- · Understand functions of male and female reproductive systems
- · Identify ways to manage physical, social, and emotional changes during puberty
- · Describe how puberty and physical development vary
- Recognize that puberty prepares the body for reproduction

HIV/AIDS Prevention:

Define HIV/AIDS

- · Discuss how HIV is transmitted and methods of prevention
- Define abstinence (6th grade only)
- · Identify examples of protective factors and examples of risk behaviors (6th grade only)
