Community - Glacier Peak High School (GPHS) is one of two high schools in the Snohomish School District. GPHS is a comprehensive, four-year public high school located south of the town of Snohomish. We congratulated our first graduating class in June 2010. Our staff is dedicated to providing all students with the best possible education in a safe, positive and secure environment. We encourage our students to be focused, enthusiastic and active participants in learning for the good of the GPHS community and the community at large.

Student Body - Enrollment for 2017-2018 is 1,795 students, 50% male and 50% female.

Faculty - We have 76 certificated full-time and part-time teachers. Our faculty/student ratio is 1:24.

Accreditation – We are accredited through the Northwest Accreditation Commission (NWEAC - formerly known as the Northwest Association of Accredited Schools). Our first on-site visit to obtain NWAC accreditation was completed in November 2009.

Curriculum – GPHS provides many choices for students, including:

Grading System – Grade point averages are computed in terms of letter grades only. A “pass” grade (P) satisfies course requirements but is not used in GPA. No courses’ grades are weighted as mandated by the State of Washington.

High School Graduation Requirements

- Attendance - Students graduating from GPHS must attend eight semesters of high school or its equivalent and earn 22 credits. One-half credit is equal to one period of instruction for one semester of 90 days.
- Credit Requirements - The subjects listed below are required for graduation and must be included in the 22 credits.
- Community Service – Documentation of eight hours is required.
- High School Proficiency Examination – Students must complete the State of Washington proficiency examinations to complete graduation requirements.
