## What is Running Start?

Running Start is a program that allows 11th and 12th grade students to take college courses at a community or technical college.

- High school and college credits
- Classes are at the college
- Taught by college instructors
- Full-time or part-time
- College level placement required for tuition free enrollment




## What is Running Start?

- **&**Up to 15 credits Tuition Free
- \*Families incur some costs: textbooks, class fees, parking, under 100 level courses
- \*Summer classes are not tuition free
- \*Transportation is not provided to the college.
- \* Students must maintain good standing in GPA.

Any course not listed in a subject area above can be taken, but will be given elective credit only.

Each college credit is equal to 0.2 high school credit. (Example: 5 college credits = 1.0 high school credit)



#### College vs. High School Credits

A Running Start student is eligible up to a maximum of 15 college credits tuition-free per quarter. This is considered a full time college student. If you are part-time, you will be eligible for less credits per quarter.

• One 5 credit college class is equivalent to 1 credit at the high school. For example, if you take English 101 (5 credits) at the community college that will count for the entire year of English 11 at the high school.



# Semesters vs. Quarters

- GP has two semesters>3 high school credits per semester>6 high school credits per year
- Running Start has three quarters>15
   college credits/3 high school credits
   each quarter> 45 college credits/9
   high school credits in one year

- To add/withdraw from a course, the student must complete the college Add/Drop process by the college deadline and notify the high school counselor.

Juation requiremen If the student plans to transfer, it is the student's responsibility to determine college admissions policies/deadlines and whether credits will transfer.
  - The student and parent's signatures below provide permission for the high school and college to share the Running Start student's ar idemic records, whi can include the student's grades, billing, registration, and attendance records regardless of whether FERPA rights belong to the student or parents. After completing the college coursework, students are responsible for requesting offical college transcripts through the college's registrar office.
