Requirement For All 2020 Scholarships

2020 Providence General Children's Association Scholarship—\$2,500

Qualifications

1. Must be a graduating high school senior (except in the case of a renewal).
2. Must have completed 75 hours of volunteer service as a member of the Providence Regional Medical Center Volunteer or Camp Prov Programs.

Dorothy Bogdanovich Scholarship—\$2,500

Qualifications

1. Must be a graduating high school senior (except in the case of a renewal).
2. Must be a volunteer at Providence Regional Medical Center and have completed 75 hours of volunteer service during high school career.
3. Must be pursuing a career as a health care practitioner (i.e., nurse, doctor, therapist).

Eileen Denhoff Scholarship—\$2,500

Qualifications

1. Must be a graduating high school senior (except in the case of a renewal).
2. Must have completed 75 hours of volunteer service at Providence Regional Medical Center. Special consideration will be given to applicants with at least 35 of those hours working at the Twig Shop and/or The Gift Shop at the Pacific Campus.

Jeannette Pearson Scholarship—\$2,500

Qualifications

1. Must be a graduating high school senior (except in the case of a renewal).
2. Must have completed 75 hours of volunteer service at Providence Regional Medical Center. Special consideration will be given to applicants with at least 35 of those hours working at the Twig Shop and/or The Gift Shop at the Pacific Campus.

Mary Jane Miller Scholarship—\$2,500

Qualifications

1. Must be currently enrolled in college on a career path that is beneficial to children or the healthcare of children. This is the only scholarship that is available to a current college student.
2. Must have been a past or current volunteer in direct service at Providence Medical Center and completed 75 hours of volunteer service hours and must have recent community service hours in community of current residence.

Applications are open to graduating high school seniors and past recipients currently enrolled in college who have worked in the Providence Regional Medical Center Volunteer or Camp Prov Programs or The Twig Shop at the Colby Campus and/or The Gift Shop at the Pacific Campus. **Exception: The Mary Jane Miller scholarship is for students currently enrolled in college.** All applications must include:

1. Two letters of recommendation from persons other than a relative. Letters need to be requested at least two weeks before the application is due.
2. One evaluation letter from the applicant's volunteer coordinator or department supervisor.
3. Official academic transcripts
4. Personal résumé

All applications must be computer generated in a 12-point font.
