

## NONINSTRUCTIONAL OPERATIONS

### Student Walking Distances

Students whose homes are more than one radius mile from the destination school site, or students whose route stop is established because of hazardous walking conditions and whose stop is less than one radius mile from the school destination, may be provided transportation services. Disabled students who are unable to walk or would not be able to provide for their own welfare while walking to school shall be provided transportation services, regardless of the distance from their homes to their schools.

Each year, the superintendent shall present to the board for approval by resolution the facts and rationale for transporting students who live within one radius mile of their school and for whom there appears sufficient justification for the district to claim a transportation reimbursement from the state. The resolution shall then be transmitted to the Educational Service District and the Office of the State Superintendent of Public Instruction for approval.
