1. There are 4 parts to the AP test, you are going to get a head start on how to succeed on part 1- multiple choice. Read the Tom Richey guide to the multiple choice section, watch the videos and then practice your multiple choice skills for the first two historical eras.

2. Period 1 (1491-1607) in the AP US History curriculum.

Options – read the chapter, watch the videos, do your own study on period 1

Read Chapter 1 of our textbook, “America: A Narrative History”.

3. Period 2 (1607-1754) in the AP US History curriculum.

Read Chapter 2,3 and 4 of our textbook, “America: A Narrative History”.

- These notes CAN be used on the first reading quiz on the first Tuesday of school.
- These notes CAN be used as makeup points if you are unhappy with your test score.
- I am including practice multiple choice questions and documents
