

All you need to do by high school graduation is:


- Earn and maintain a 3.0 GPA

ABOUT COLLEGE CAREER: ALL ABOUT APPRENTICESHIPS

In an apprenticeship, you can earn money while learning through a combination of handson, on-the-job training (OJT) and related academic classes.

Apprenticeships are competitive and rigorous, and are typically more demanding than internships.

Apprenticeships are offered by employers (such as Boeing), **trade unions** (such as electricians or roofers) and independent programs.

Programs typically last 2-5 years and are a good way to start a career in a well-paying field. Apprenticeship programs offer certifications, licenses and/or college degrees.

HOW MUCH WOULD I GET PAID?

Apprentices earn money while in the program; the pay increases as they

progress. Upon graduation, they become "journey-level" workers.

- Typically last 2-5 years
- Get paid while learning
- Welding, electrician, manufacturing, construction, etc.
- Receive certification, licensure, and/or college degree







PROS AND CONS



Early Decision is a binding process, meaning, if one is accepted, one must attend the college or university.



Early Action is a process in which one applies early, but is not bound to the school if one is accepted

Early Decision (ED)

A student who is accepted an ED applicant must attend the college



Apply early to 1st choice college



Receive admissions by December



Agree to attend college if accepted



Apply to only 1 college ED



Withdraw all other applications if accepted



Send nonrefundable check before May 1st

Early Action (EA)

A student receives an early response to application, but does not have to commit to that college until the normal May1st reply date. It is nonbinding.



Apply early



Receive admission by January/February



Do not have to commit upon receipt







HOW AND WHEN CAN I GET A MID-YEAR AND FINAL TRANSCRIPT?

Your mid-year transcript will be available 2nd week of February. You will get your final transcript along with your high school diploma at the end of June.

You can always request your unofficial transcript through our registrar, Cecilia Goritsas.

Counselors will upload your transcript to Common App if we're added as a recommender.
