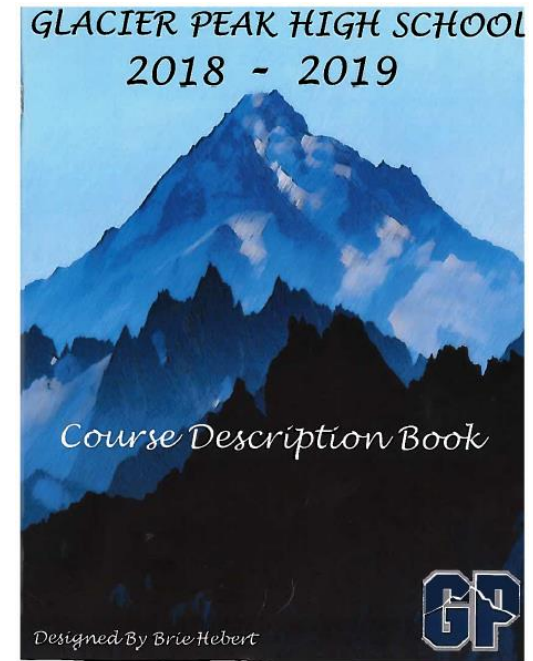

How to Register for your classes

1. Students and parents discuss future plans.
2. Look at the Course Description Book.
 - Is there a Pre-requisite?
 - What grade level can take the class?
 - Year-long class or Semester-long class?
 - Does it fit in with your High School and Beyond Plan?
3. Go to “Preview the Peak” on **Thursday February 22nd**
4. Fill out 4-year plan
5. Register for classes on Skyward.
 - Must use STUDENT login and password
 - You can register online starting Friday February 23rd.
6. We will be meeting with all 8th graders at Valley View on **Monday February 26th** in the computer lab to help with online registration.





Our goal is to create a schedule for each student that consists of the classes he/she needs to graduate and that meets his/her future education and career goals. Each student creates a High School & Beyond Plan (4-year plan) and chooses his/her classes during Registration in the spring.

We build our master schedule based on student requests. All schedules are reviewed by Counselors for accuracy. It is very important that students carefully read course descriptions and choose appropriate alternate options when registering. **After schedules are created based on our thorough Registration process, only legitimate schedule change requests will be considered.** Please see page 4 in the Course Description Book for more information.
